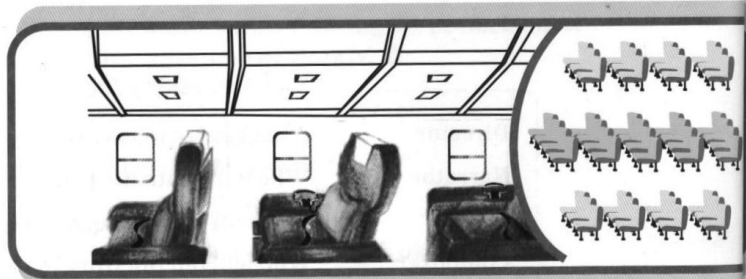
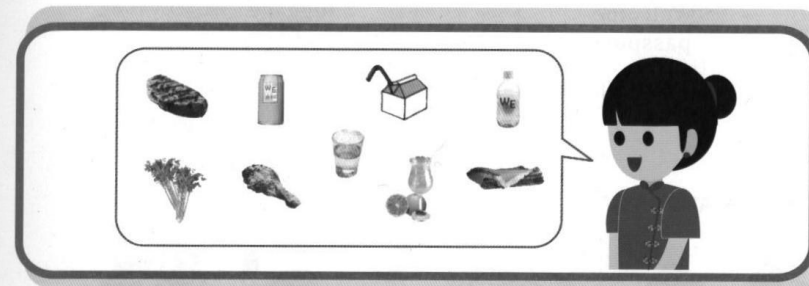
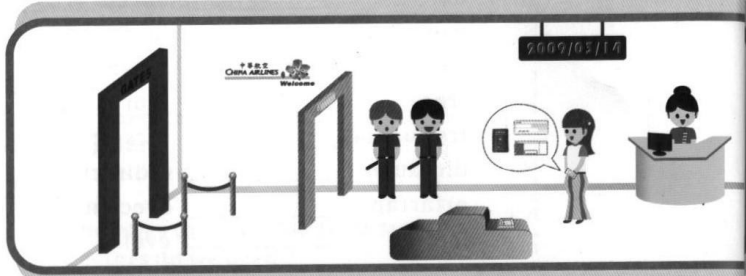


Wufu Airport
